the early second millennium AD. The Java Sea Shipwreck was an Indonesian ship discovered off the coast of Java in the late 1980s by fishermen and was excavated in 1996. Included in the vessel's cargo are high-fired ceramics and iron from China and earthenware, resin, and ivory from Southeast Asia and other parts of the Indian Ocean World. Also present are

items likely used by the crew and merchants onboard, such as sharpening stones, scale bars and weights, glass, and other sundries. Not only does the ship's cargo attest to the massive scale of production and exchange of material goods at the time, it also presents intriguing possibilities regarding the people Tang Hall of China, which covers more than 10,000 years of Chinese prehistory and history; the second was China's First Emperor and His Terracotta Warriors.
