Thursday, April 18 - 7:30 PM DEBTS, CRIME, AND PRISON: DAILY LIFE IN BABYLONIA ca. 1200 BCE By Susanne Paulus, Ph.D.

When history is considered, it is often restricted to the dealings of outstanding individuals or entities: gods, kings, and heroes. The struggles of "everyday people" are usually neglected.

Using the rich document corpus of clay tablets found in the excavations of the Babylonian cities of Ur and Nippur in present-day Iraq, this program will allow a glimpse into the daily life of the middle and lower classes around 1200 BC. Special focus will be on problems still well-known to us today, including family trouble and indebtedness.

Dr. Susanne Paulus is Assistant Professor of Assyriology at the Oriental Institute, University of Chicago. Her main research focus is on the Middle Babylonian Period/Kassite Period in Iraq (1500-1000 BC). She received her MA and PhD from the University of Muenster (Germany).

The Kankakee Protohistory Project is bringing together excavation and environmental analyses to reconstruct the entangled human and environmental histories of the Kankakee River, from protohistory to the present.

Since 2016, a multi-year excavation project has been underway at Midewin National Tallgrass Prairie of a Huber site occupied during the early 17th century. This well-preserved, very late prehistoric village is expanding our understanding of lifeways during the final period before European arrival.

Material has already been recovered that raises questions about the size of the interaction sphere among "very late prehistoric" Native Americans who had at least indirect access to the Mississippi River.
