SSAS MEMBERS, TOUR OF CHICAGO PORTAGE NATIONAL HISTORIC SITE

Please join us on this special tour for SSAS members and their guests! A small, unremarkable ditch on the west side of Harlem Avenue, just north of the Stevenson Expressway (enter at Portage Woods Forest Preserve), is protected by National Historic Site status. The short and shallow ditch is the reason a great city grew near it, and is a key link in Chicago's largely unknown birth story. Chicago owes its very existence to the location of the Chicago Portage. The site and several forest preserves mark the presence of Native American villages and early European settlement, including the remains of inns for travelers. The first European explorers, Jolliet and Marquette, passed through the Portage in 1673. It provided an easy connection between the Atlantic and the Gulf of Mexico by linking Lake Michigan with the Mississippi River.

One of only two National Historic Sites in Illinois, the Chicago Portage area is the only place where you can stand on the same ground walked upon by Native Americans, and all the explorers, early settlers and creators of Chicago! It is located on the west side of Harlem Avenue (4800 S. Harlem), just 2 blocks north of the Stevenson Expressway (I-55) (see map on insert page.) If traveling north on Harlem, turn left (west) into the main parking lot of Portage Woods. (Any visitor overflow will be directed to Ottawa Trail Woods on the north side of 47<sup>th</sup> Street.) Gather by 10:00 AM at the Marquette & Jolliet sculpture, where our tour will begin. (Note: A "porto" restroom facility is available.)

The tour will last approximately 1½ hours, with pauses along the way, and is about ½ mile in length on a gravel path through the woods. We will also explore some sites "off the path," so please wear long pants and walking shoes or boots. You may also want to bring insect repellent, sunscreen and bottled water.

The fee for this excursion is \$10.00 per person (at the site). Please contact Will Kelley to get on the tour roster, if you have questions.

#### \*THE ORIENTAL INSTITUTE - On Monday, August 12,


Professor Jodi Magness, President of the Archaeological Institute of America (UNC/Chapel Hill), will present "Masada: Last Stronghold of the Jewish Revolt Against Rome." This program will survey Herod's palaces on Masada, explore archaeological remains associated with the Roman siege of the mountain in 73-74 CE (which were excavated by Magness in 1995), and include a discussion of Josephus' account of the mass Jewish suicide.

After the program, Professor Magness will sign copies of her book, *Masada: From Jewish Revolt to Modern Myth*.
