#### Archaeological Institute of America, Central Illinois (Urbana) Society

Friday, February 26 – 3:00 pm "Working a Case on Looted & Smuggled Ancient Coins as an Expert Witness" - Law enforcement and federal prosecutors have sometimes been reticent to pursue antiquities trafficking cases involving looted and smuggled ancient coins because of an unfamiliarity with the material and a false assumption that there is no way to identify a country of origin. With more than a decade's experience of working with federal law enforcement and ancient coin circulation, Dr. Nathan T. Elkins of Baylor University will outline the methodology for working cases on ancient coins and identifying their origins, and will discuss his personal experiences. ### In the News!! From the Crown of Henry VIII

The Tudor crown of King Henry VIII is one of the most notable pieces of lost treasure in British history. Now, more than 400 years after its disappearance, the crown's gold centerpiece has been unearthed by a metal detectorist in Northamptonshire, England.

In September 2017, Kevin Duckett was hunting for treasure in a field at the Market Harborough Golf Club when his metal detector picked up something beneath his feet. He uncovered a 1.4-inch tall, 24-carat gold figurine that he could not immediately identify, but was eventually able to link to the reign of Henry VIII.

The gold statuette, made in the early 16<sup>th</sup> century, depicts Henry VI as a saint and was part of a set of three "saint kings" on the state crown that also included St. Edmund and Edward the Confessor.



Historians had feared that the entire crown was lost for good. When the monarchy fell in 1649, Oliver Cromwell's anti-royalist parliament melted down many royal treasures to make coins, and sold off the jewels. (The 344 gems in Henry's crown were sold off for about 1,100 pounds at the time.) But this part of the crown has survived. The artifact's authenticity will be further assessed by the British Museum and a portion of its estimated \$2.7 million value may go to Kevin Duckett and the owner of the recovery site.
