Ancient Egyptians believed sleep and death were closely related, so both the living and the dead needed similar objects. learn how to sleep like an Egyptian by joining Catherine Witt in an exploration of daily life and death in

ancient Egypt, where headrests and related objects, such as beds and figurines, would have supported their owners both in this world and the next. We will also wrap in a discussion of the magical powers of headrest imagery and amulets for raising the deceased in the afterlife, revealing the symbolic

significance of headrests to people of the time.

Ms. Witt received her MA from the University of Chicago, where she is a doctoral candidate in Egyptology focusing on the lives of ancient Egyptian women and the material culture of the period.
